



HOW TO MAKE A SEED SPACING RULER

Proper spacing of seeds means that gardeners don't need to thin plants later and better production of vegetables. Keeping that spacing even and accurate is made easier with this simple seed spacing ruler project.

Supplies

A Drill

½" Spade Drill Bit (or other size depending on seed)

A Yard Stick / Ruler / Scrap Piece of Wood

If using a scrap piece of wood, mark 1" intervals on the wood with a pencil.

Drill holes at every inch mark on the ruler, yardstick, or marked piece of wood. Sand rough edges, if desired.

To Use: Dig shallow trench in garden soil. Drop seeds into holes at necessary intervals and push slightly into the soil. Remove ruler and cover seeds completely.
